The Jokkmokk Fishing Guide

Welcome to sportfishing in Jokkmokk, here you can experience fishing at it's best. Jokkmokk is the second largest municipality in Sweden (square kilometers), which means there are incredible opportunities for sportfishing in all forms. If you wish it's also possible to combine your fishing with other outdoor activities such as dog sledging, hiking, canoeing etc etc.

In Jokkmokk we have fishing opportunities for everyone whether you are a specimen hunter searching for giant roach (*Rutilus rutilus*) or a flyfisher trying to catch arctic charrs (*Salvelinus alpinus*) in the mountain areas.

This Fishing Guide has been produced as an aid for sportfishers who are not familiar to the area. It contains contacts, phone numbers that will help you find the fishing you are looking for.

One of the best known areas in Jokkmokk is the Pärälven, an approx 50 km pristine river that runs from the mountain area down through the subalpine forests. The Pärälven river offers great opportunities to catch Grayling (*Thymallus thymallus*) but you might also have a chance to encounter large brown trout.



Other species which you can encounter while fishing in Jokkmokk are Brown Trout (*Salmo trutta*), which is a quite common and each year there are some really large ones caught (mostly in the outlet areas of the water reservoirs), Northern Pike (*Esox lucius*) is a common species and it's not unusual to catch specimens with a weight more than 5kg (??LBS) Perch (*Perca fluviatilis*) you can find in most waters, Burbot (*Lota lota*) mostly when ice fishing, Whitefish (*Coregonus sp*) common but not so easy to catch. In some waters you can also find introduced species, Rainbow trout (*Salmo gairdneri*), Canadian char (*Salvelinus namaycush*).

REMEMBER!

- It is always your **responsibility** to find out what restrictions apply for the waters you are fishing. Regulations and the price of fishing licenses often vary based on who administers the area and the quality of the fishing. Usually, this information is automatically provided when you purchase your fishing license. If requested, you must be able to present a valid fishing license for the water you are fishing.
- Do not keep more fish than you can use and adhere to all bag limits and minimum size regulations. The majority of the owners of fishing rights and fishing associations have opened their waters to the public for sport and pleasure fishing, not as a source of food. It is important that anglers not take advantage of this trust by filling their freezers with fish.
- How do you release a fish that you have caught? Wet your hands (a dry hand can damage a fish's sensitive mucous layer) and remove the hook carefully. If possible, remove the hook and release the fish without picking the fish up out of the water. Use the appropriate tools for each species/size and pull the fish in as fast as possible.
- If you catch a fish with a tag or a fin that has been cut off (the adipose fin is removed), please follow the instructions on the tag or report the catch to the municipal fisheries consultant, phone 0971-172 10. Do not forget to record the fish's length, weight and where it was caught.
- Keep nature clean! This old saying is still relevant. There is nothing worse than coming to a camping site where rubbish is piled up. Use the existing rubbish bins or carry your rubbish out with you. For everyone's sake.
- Have fun, enjoy the outdoors and share your fishing stories from your trip with your friends and family!

Die Regionalverwaltung informiert

Die Regionalverwaltung (Länsstyrelsen) ist verantwortlich für den Fischbestand in den staatlichen Gewässern oberhalb der Anbau-grenze, d.h. in der Bergregion. Wir haben das Sportangeln in den verschiedenen Samengemeinden koordiniert. Deshalb ist das Angeln in fast allen Gewässern mit demselben Angelschein – der Jokkmokkskortet – möglich. Davon ausgenommen sind Gewässer in Nationalparks und in Regionen, in denen die samische Bevölkerung Fische für ihren eigenen Bedarf fängt. Im Gebiet Padjelanta ist das Angeln im Abstand von einem Kilometer zum Weg erlaubt. In Gebirgsgewässern nimmt die Fischpopulation nur sehr langsam zu. Es dauert relativ lange, bis ein Fisch zu seiner Fanggröße herangewachsen ist.

Damit die Fischqualität auch in Zukunft erhalten bleibt, empfehlen wir Ihnen, verantwortungsbewusst zu angeln und Ihr Fangvolumen in diesen Gewässern einzuschränken.

Als Faustregel gilt: Behalten Sie nur den Fisch, den Sie unmittelbar verzehren können. Alle anderen Fische sollten Sie wieder aussetzen.

The County Administrative Board keeps you informed

The Norrbotten County Administrative Board is the public authority that administers fishing in State waters above the Cultivation Line, i.e. the area we usually mean when we refer to the mountains. Since we have co-ordinated sport fishing in the various Sami villages in the municipality, you may fish in the large majority of waters by purchasing a single fishing license – **The Jokkmokk Fishing License**. Fishing is not allowed, though, in the national parks and waters that are reserved for Sami (Lapp) use. An exception is if you are hiking in Padjelanta National Park. Here you are allowed to fish in waters within one kilometre from the hiking trail.

In most cases, mountain waters are not very productive, and it takes a long time for fish to grow to minimum catch sizes. To maintain the quality of the fishing, we recommend that you fish responsibly and limit how many fish you take from these waters. A good rule of thumb is to only save fish you need for that day's meal and to return all other fish. For fishing regulations and other information, see the map you receive when you purchase your Jokkmokk Fishing License.

1. The Padjelanta Trail
The Padjelanta Trail runs through Padjelanta National Park. Sportfishing is allowed in the area close to the trail, with special restrictions. For more detailed information please visit www.fallen.nu or the local tourist office.

2. Lake Kutjaure
Fishing for char on the edge of the Padjelanta National Park. Very popular fishing site for traditional icefishing.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

3. The Vuojatätno river
Stream running from the Padjelanta National Park into Akkajaure. Fish the flowing waters in the shadow of the mighty Akka Mountain.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

4. Lake Akkajaure – The Sourva reservoir
One of Sweden's largest water reservoirs. Primarily for ice fishing. The fish are often deep so make sure you bring plenty of line on your reel. The lake can be easily accessed since the road to the west follows the lake.

5. The Rävvejaure area
This is a good area for ice fishing. Rävvejaure is a high altitude area, previous experience from alpine conditions is recommended.

6. The Tarrariver
Stream with excellent opportunities for flyfishing, the upper parts mainly arctic char and brown trout and the lower parts grayling.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

7. Lake Pietsaure
Lake close to the Sarek National Park. Here you can meet the Kuoljok family at Pietsaure Camp. Here you can fish for arctic char both summer and winter. If you are lucky you can experience the marking of the reindeer calves on the lake's east side during the summer. For information, contact Apmot-Erik Kuoljok, phone 0971-102 89.

8. The Kvikkjokk Fishing Permit.
This permit allows you to fish in some waters close to the Kvikkjokk village.
Fishing Permit: Kvikkjokk landowners ass.

9. Lake Stuur-Tata and lake Sjabtjakjaure
Ice fishing waters in the shadow of Sarek Mountain. The lakes are situated along the Kungsleden trail and are easy to reach.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

10. The Upmask area
There are several small sport fishing waters east of Snierak. These lakes are perfect for day trips for visitors from Kvikkjokk. Lake Upmask has good ice fishing.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

11. Lake Sitojaure
Large lake in high-alpine environment, fishing only permitted 1/1 – 2/5 and 1/10 – 31/12.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

12. Lake Laitaure
Lake in the outlet of the Rapa river close to Sarek National Park, fishing only permitted 1/1 – 2/5 and 1/10 – 31/12.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

13. The Lastak area
Small lakes in the outskirts of the mountain Kabla, popular for ice-fishing when the weather is too bad for higher altitudes.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

14. Jaurekaska
Rapids between Lake Langas and Lake Stora Lulevattnet, easy access from road, special restrictions for boatfishing.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

15. Skieltajokk
Quota-based water. Special permit obligated. For further information please visit www.fallen.nu

16. Lake Raktenjaure area
Small-medium size lakes and streams in the subalpine forest, easy access from road.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

17. "Strycket"(Tjämotis)
The outlet from Blackälven to lake Skalka, easy access from main road to Kvikkjokk.
Fishing Permit: Tjämotis village Community

18. Lake Salasjaure
Medium size lake in the subalpine area. Most visitors come to Salas in the early spring for ice fishing.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

19. Lake Harrok
A lake with the unusual combination of grayling, char and dace. Wind shelter and privy is available.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

20. Lake Karats
Large lake in the upper parts of the Pärälven system. Suitable for boatfishing.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit



21. The Låkkejaure area
Lakes and small streams, easy access during summertime.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

22. Nautasjåkká/Nautijaure river
A small/medium size stream in the boreal forest, it has its origin at Ultevis. This is the place to be for anglers who aren't afraid of being out in the wilderness.
Fishing Permit: Three different fishing licenses in the area. Above the limit of cultivation/The Jokkmokk Permit. Below the limit of cultivation /Jokkmokk's commonage Owners Association (allmänning) and Randijaure village Community.

23. Lake Stora Lulevattnet
Large water reservoir upstream Porjus. Special permit for trolling.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit

24. The Staina lakes
Lakes close to the main road to Kvikkjokk, easy access. Fishing Permit: Jokkmokk's Commonage Owners Association (allmänning).

25. Lake Kallakjaure
Medium size lake with put and take fishing. Fishing Permit: Jokkmokk's Commonage Owners Association (allmänning).

26. Lake Laddon
Large lake in the boreal forest, suitable for boatfishing. Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit.

27. Lake Randijaure
The outlet area from the Parki hydroelectric power station is a hot-spot for large Browntrout and Grayling.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit/Randijaure village community.

28. Lake Åremjaure
Lake in the boreal forest. Suitable for flyfishing, large graylings.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit.

29. River Pärälven
The last wild river in Jokkmokk, approximately 50 km long. You can find signs, rest cabins, fire pits, and suspension bridges. The river is easy to access. Some parts are quota-based, flyfishing-only. Pay special attention to the fishing restrictions. There are signs, a special fishing map, and information sheets for the area.
Suitable for both flyfishing and spinnfishing. Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

30. Tuorponjåhkká
Small stream in the boreal forest.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit.

31. Lake Gäddsjön
Small put and take lake. Suitable for flyfishing and spinnfishing.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

32. The Pakko area
Small lakes and streams. Some natural, some put and take. Fishing allowed with natural bait. Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit.

33. The Purki rapids
Rapid between lake Purkijaure and Lake Vajkijaur. Windshelters and privy are available for free. Easy access, suitable for both flyfishing and spinnfishing.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

34. Porjussellet
The outlet area from the Porjus hydroelectric power station. Popular place for spinnfishing, especially early summer.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk Permit.

35. Lake Stor-Skabram
Put and take fishing close to Jokkmokk. Very popular around midsummer.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

36. Lake Lill-Skabram
Specimen size roach (*Rutilus rutilus*). One of the leading lakes in Sweden during the last 5 years. Special fishing permits and regulations.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

37. Lake Sjatjerim/Ailis
Very good pike fishing. Windshelters are available for free.
Fishing Permit: Vajkijaur hunting and fishing.

38. Lake Vajkijaur
Large lake close to Jokkmokk. Boatfishing recommended. Good land based fishing in the Stensundet and Hösundet area.
Fishing Permit: Vajkijaur hunting and fishing.

39. Lake Kierats
A number of put and take lakes close to the arctic circle area. Very popular family fishing. Easy access from main road to Älvsbyn. Windshelters are available for free.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

40. Lake Talvatis
Small lake in central Jokkmokk. Put and take fishing, best fishing around midsummer. Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

41. The Kronogård area
A beautiful area with over 200 lakes. Some with natural fish populations and some put and take. The area has maintained trails and rest areas. Snowmobile trails to fishing waters are prepared in the winter.
Fishing Permit: Kronogård.

42. Kaitum selet
The area between Akkats hydroelectric power station and Mattisudden. Popular for all kinds of fishing methods. Free sportfishing. Fishing permit: Free.

43. The Larve area.
Lakes in the boreal forests with natural fish populations and some old put and take waters. Fishing permit: Sveaskog.

44. Lake Käbdalisjaure
Lake in central Käbdalis. Free sportfishing. Fishing permit: Free.

45. Lake Varvojaure
Put and take lake close to the Käbdalis ski centre.
Fishing permit: Käbdalis fishing conservation association.

46. Lake Kante
Put and take lake close to Käbdalis.
Fishing permit: Käbdalis fishing conservation association.

47. Vitbäcken
Small sized stream. Some parts are easy accessed from the main road to Älvsbyn. Nice flyfishing. Fishing permit: Käbdalis fishing conservation association.

48. Lake Fatjas
Large put and take lake close to road 45. Boatfishing recommended.
Fishing permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

49. The Messaure reservoir
Large reservoir with special trolling permit. "Big fish swims these waters"
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association.

50. The Porsi reservoir
One of the best known places for large Brown trout is the outlet from Messaure hydroelectric power station.
Fishing Permit: The Jokkmokk fishing and hunting association

51. The Letsi reservoir
Large reservoir downstream Jokkmokk, popular Pike(*Esox lucius*) and Perch(*Perca fluviatilis*) fishing.
Fishing Permit: Sveaskog

52. Lake Holmträsket
Large lake close to the village Snesudden. Boatfishing recommended.
Fishing Permit: Holmträsk/Snesudden fishing conservation association.

53. Lake Utterträsket/Långträsket
Put and take lakes. Windshelters are available for free. Fishing Permit: Holmträsk/Snesudden fishing conservation association.

54. The Högräsk area.
Put and take lakes close to the village Högräsk. Fishing Permit: Högräsk fishing and hunting association.

55. The Soutaure area.
Area with a number of small put and take lakes. Easy access. Fishing Permit: Jokkmokk's Commonage Owners Association (allmänning).

56. Lake Nourtasup
Put and take lake. Windshelters, privies are available for free. Suitable for disabled persons. Easy access.
Fishing Permit: The Vuollerim fishing association (Skifteslag)

57. Upper Kuouka
Put and take lakes. Windshelters are available for free. Fishing Permit: The Kuouka fishing conservation association.

58. The Båstaträsk area.
A number of small put and take lakes. Area accessed by marked trails, 0,5-2 km. Fishing permit: The Vuollerim fishing association (Skifteslag)

59. Soinakbäcken
Small stream. Easy access. Brown trout fishing. Fishing permit: The Vuollerim fishing association (Skifteslag)

60. Lake Tjälmask
Small put and take lake, easy access. Fishing Permit: Käikul village community

61. Lake Långträsk/Kalsoktjärnen area.
Put and take lakes. Good fishing both during the summer and winter.
Fishing Permit: The Porsi fishing association (skifteslag).

62. Lake Tröllomtjärnen
Small put and take lake close to Vuollerim. Windshelter available for free.
Fishing Permit: Vattenfall sportfishing club.

63. The Laxede reservoir
The outlet from pors hydroelectric power station. Easy access, close to Vuollerim. Good spot for large Brown trout.
Fishing Permit: The Vuollerim fishing association (Skifteslag)

64. The Murjek area
Good fishing in Aimobäcken, a small stream in the boreal forest. A number of lakes in the area holds brown trout, char and Perch.
Fishing Permit: Murjek hunting and fishing.

65. The Sjuoggijaure area
The area holds around 20 smaller lakes with Brown trout, Char and Grayling. Large Perch can also be found in the area.
Fishing Permit: Jokkmokk's Commonage Owners Association (allmänning).
